The premises are described in the Grant as "All that and those the said two plots of ground described in said Original Lease as being 'part of South Priors Land in the South Liberties of the City of Limerick, and therein described ns being marked number 6 and 7 in the Map of the said premises in the possession of the said Earl of Limerick, containing in front 186 feet and bounded by the new street called Perry-street, in the rere 186 feet, bounded by a former street, which is now stopped up and which runs between the said plots of ground in the possession of John Wallace and the said James Myles, in depth on the North side thereof 15 feet, bounded by Hartstonge-place, and on the South side thereof 6 feet, bounded by a stable lane running from Mallow-street to Boherbuoy, together with as much of the former street as runs at the rcre of the plot of ground hereby demised,"

The Grant reserves all royalties.




