

The premises arc described in the Grant as "All that and those the lott of ground part of South Priors Land, formerly situate in the South Liberties of the City of Limerick, but now under the provisions of the Municipal Boundaries Act, situate in the County of the City of Limerick, containing in front to Glentworthstreet, 96 feet, and an half, and from front to rere 150 feet, be the same more or less, bounded on the West by Glentworth-street. on the East by a stable lane, on the South by a new street called Dominick-street, and on the North by Nicholas Hannan's holding."

The Grant reserves all mines, minerals arid royalties, and also reserves out of the said premises a stable lane of at least 8 feet wide, at the rere thereof for the use of the said premises and of the premises adjoining.
