The premises are described in the Grant as "All that the aforesaid lot of ground part of South Priors Land, in the South Liberties of the City of Limerick, containing in front 50 feet, and from front to rere 160 feet, be the same more or less, bounded on the South in front by Catherine-street, on the East by Robert O'Callaghan Newenham's holdings, and on the North and West by the said Joseph Fisher'...: holdings."

Edmond Lord Viscount Pery to Joseph Fisher.

The Grant reserves all mines, minerals and royalties.

The Grantee covenants to keep in repair the premises and all houses, edifices, buildings and other improvements.
