
Fee-farm Grant, dated 27th June, 1872, made between William Hale John Charles, Earl of Limerick, of the one part, and Robert Dundas of the other part, in conversion of a Renewable Lease, dated 9th June, 1796, from Sir Henry Hartstonge to Thomas Knox.

The piemises are described in the Grant as "All that snd those the hereditaments and premises by the said hereinbefore recited Original Indenture of Lease of the 9th day of June, 1796, demised and therein described as follows, that is to say:—'the plot or angle of ground adjoining the premises lately set by Lord Viscount Pery to Thomas McMahon, and marked C in the Map annexed to the Lease under which the said Sir Henry Hartstonge holds the said premises From Lord Pery, bounded on one front by the street leading from the new bridge toward Saint George's Church, and on another front by the cross street running down to the River Shannon, as more particularly laid down and described in the said Map, together with the tythes thereof, all which said premises are part of South Priors Land, and situate, lying and being in the South Liberties of the City of Limerick."
