

Fee-farm Grant, dated 23rd February, 1853. made between William Henry Tennison, Earl of Limerick of the one part, and Standish Darby O'Grady of the other part, in conversion of a Renewable Lease, dated 10th February, 1798. from Edmond Lord Viscount Pery to William Marritt.

The premises are described in the Grant as "All that the aforesaid plot of ground, marked No. 7 in the Map annexed to said Original Lease, being part of the field next to Captain Hill's former holdings, Newtown Pery, and part of South Priors Land, formerly in the possession of the said William Marritt, containing from East to West 50 feet, and from North to South 300 feet, he the same more or less, bounded on the West with the Lot. No. G, in the said annexed Map, on the East with Thomas McMahon's holdings, on the North with the street leading from the late Sir Henry Hartstonge's holdings to the late John Dowdall Hammond's holding, and on the South with George-street, formerly situate in the South Liberties of the City of Limerick, but now in the Parish of Saint, Michael and City or Borough of Limerick."
