

Fee-farm Grant, dated 26th January, 1855, made between Henry Tennison, Earl of Limerick. of the one part, and Standish O'Grady Holland of the other part, in conversion of a Renewable Lease, dated 9th August, 1794, from Edmond Lord Viscount Pery, to William Holland.

The premises are described in the Grant as "All that arid those the plot of ground comprised in and demised by said Original Lease, and therein described as 'part of South Priors Land in the South Liberties of the City of Limerick, containing in front to the new strret leading from the new bridge 122 feet, in rere 162 feet, in depth on the East side 324 fect, and on the West 369 fect. bounded on the East by the Strand, on the West by the Reverend Dean Hoare's holding and part of South Priors ground, and on the North by the Strand, and on the South in front by the said street on which two dwelling-houses and other improvements have been made, together with the tithes thereof, according to a Map thereunto annexed."

The Grantee covenants to keep in repair the premises and all buildings and other improvements.
