Fee-farm Grant, dated 7th September, 1857, made between William Henry Tennison, Earl of Limerick, of the one part, and Francis Spaight of the other part, in conversion of a Renewable Lease, dated 10th June, 1767, from Edmond Sexton Perv to John Dowdall Hammond.

The premises are described in the Grant as "All that and those the plot of ground described in and demised by the said recited Original Lease as being 'part of South Priors ground in the South Liberties of the City of Limerick, being part of Lot, No. 13, containing in front to a cross intended street from the Custom House-quay and the New Quay then erecting by Mr. Edward Uzuld 50 feet, and in depth 150 feet, bounded on the East by a then new intended street leading between the premises and Mr. Angell Maunsell's holding to the River, on the West by ground of the said Lord Viscount Pery's, on the North in front by the said Cross-street, and in rere by Mr. Vigors Thomas's holdings, according to a Map thereof thereunto annexed, together with the tithes thereof.' "

The Grantee covenants to keep in repair the said premises.
