The premises are described in the Grant as "All that and those part of the Lands of Courtbrack, containing by common estimation 7 acres 1 rood and 34 perches, plantation measure, be the same more or less, as described in a Map thereunto annexed, bounded on the North-west by the River Shannon, on the South-east by the Circular-road, on the West by Mr. George Davis's holdings, and on the East by the holdings of the Reverend Deane Crosbie, situate, lying, and being in the South Liberties of the City of Limerick."

The Grant reserves liberty of hunting, hawking, fishing and fowling.

The Grantee covenants to keep in repair the premises and all improvements, inevitable accidents excepted.

Proviso for surrender on any 1st day of May, on first giving 12 months' previous notice in writing and paying all rent.

The Grant also reserves all mines, minerals and coals.
