

Fee-farm Grant, dated 17th November, 1887, made between William Hale John Charles, Earl of Limerick, of the one part, and Anna Victoria Russell, Spinster, of the other part, in conversion of a Renewable Lease, dated 12th September, 1773, from Edmond Sexton Pery to Francis Russell.
