

The premises are described in the Grant as "All that and those the plot of ground described in the said Original Lease as being in the Irish town, in the City of Limerick, containing in front to John-street 109 feet, in the rere 1153 feet, on the North side 1363 feet, and on the South side 1261 feet, bounded on the East in front by John-street, on the West by Mr. Cashen's holding, on the North by the lane leading from John's Gate to the Square, and on the South by the back street next to the town wall."

The Grantee covenants to keep in repair the premises, the accidents of fire, war and general rebellion only excepted, and that he would not cover any house or building with thatch under the penalty of an additional rent of X13 16s. 11d.

The rent set out in the Rent Column may be liable to adjustment under the Local Government Acts.
