The premises are described in the Lease as "All that and those the parcel of ground near the distillery, lying between Cashel's-lane and the public road, and between the public road and the River Shannon, formerly in the tenancy or occupation of the Representatives of John O'Brien, and known as the Thomondgate Brewery, and Brown-quay, containing in the WA Q S N 0 several admeasurements, as set out on the Map U thereof annexed hereto, and also the small plot of ground on the North-west side of Cashel'slane, containing in length to the North 57 feet, in length to the South 49 feet 2 inches, in breadth to the West 19 feet, and in breadth to 0 the East 39 feet 9 inches, be the said several admeasurements, more or less, all which said premises are situate at Cashel's-lane, and Townland of Priors Land, in the Parish of Killeely, and City of Limerick, as delineated on the Map." A The Lease reserves all mines, minerals, quarries, and S all other royalties. The Lease contains covenants by the Lessee to make sewers, etc., to the satisfaction of the Sanitary Authorities, to pay Sanitary Rates, to keep in repair, to insure in the joint names of the Lessor and Lessee for £1,000, and clause of view.
